



Habitat for Humanity of Williamson County Historical Highlights

1999:

- Habitat for Humanity of Williamson County formed as an all-volunteer organization in 1999 as Georgetown Habitat for Humanity. In 2007, that affiliate merged with Round Rock Habitat for Humanity to form Habitat for Humanity of Williamson County, Texas. (HFHWC)

2005:

- ReStore opens in Georgetown.

2008-2010:

- HFHWC completed 20 homes in the Old Mill Village neighborhood in Georgetown.

In 2012:

- HFHWC began rehabilitating homes, starting in Georgetown
- HFHWC purchased four lots in Leander

In 2013:

- HFHWC began the Affordable Home Repair Program (in Georgetown and Round Rock)
- Rehabilitated its first single, family home in Leander
- Began new construction on its first single, family home in Leander
- Purchased first lot in Jarrell

In 2014:

- HFHWC completed its first new, single family homes in Leander and Jarrell
- Provided 11 affordable home repairs in Williamson County

In 2015:

- HFHWC started building new homes in its Myrtle Street project near San Gabriel Park in Georgetown
- Completed 1 new rehab in Georgetown
- Completed 1 new home construction in Taylor
- Completed 1 new home in Georgetown
- Completed 19 Home Repair Program projects

In 2016:

- Completed 2 new homes in Leander
- Completed 1 new home in Taylor
- Completed 1 rehab home in Georgetown
- Completed 1 new home in in Georgetown
- Opened a second ReStore in Round Rock in July
