
Household Composition





LIVED IN THE HOME WITH A SPOUSE OR PARTNER

- 15% had grandchildren in their home
- 12% live with another related adult in their home

HFHWC participating households have someone with a disability living in the home.



HFHWC participating households have someone living in the home who has experienced homelessness in the past.



HFHWC participating households have someone living in the home who has applied for or received Section 8 housing in the past.




HOMEOWNERS WERE THEIR HOUSEHOLD'S PRIMARY SOURCE OF INCOME*


Commute to Work






HOMEOWNERSHIP IMPROVES HEALTH & WELLBEING

HFHWC will identify ways to foster more of a sense of control for program participants throughout the application, site selection, and

homebuilding processes.



HFHWC will further implement its pre- and post-purchase education program to help homeowners better sustain homeownership.



Future research may include investigate what factors lead to Habitat for Humanity of Williamson County homeowners staying or leaving their home and the potential impact of homeownership on the second generation of HFHWC homeowners.
